# AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, strike "Care Providers" and substitute "Assistance Services Advisory Committee"; in the same line, strike "Registry and Training" and substitute "Duties"; strike beginning with "personal" in line 3 down through "terms" in line 7 and substitute "the Personal Assistance Services Advisory Committee in the Department of Disabilities' Office of Personal Assistance Services to make recommendations to the Department on the implementation of a public registry for personal care workers"; strike beginning with "registry" in line 7 down through "providers" in line 8 and substitute "the Personal Assistance Services Advisory Committee"; in line 9, strike "adding to" and substitute "repealing and reenacting, with amendments,"; in line 10, strike "Health - General" and substitute "State Government"; strike beginning with "19-4C-01" in line 11 down through "Providers" in line 12 and substitute "9-1119(b)"; and in line 14, strike the first "2005" and substitute "2004".

### AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 1, after line 16, insert:

### "Article - State Government

### 9-1119.

- (b) (1) The purpose of the Advisory Committee is to provide guidance to the Department on personal care, attendant care, and home care services, including:
  - [(1)] (I) the development of standards for the training of personal care workers;
  - [(2)] (II) the feasibility of establishing a referral system of individual providers;

- [(3)] (III) the feasibility of establishing a registry for personal care workers; and
- [(4)] (IV) compensation levels provided to personal care workers for personal assistance services.

# (2) THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A PUBLIC REGISTRY FOR PERSONAL CARE WORKERS.".

On pages 1 through 3, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 17 on page 1 through line 6 on page 3, inclusive.
