# 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Election Law - Voting Systems - Verification and Accessibility

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring that certain voting systems produce an accessible
- voter-verified paper audit trail of a voter's ballot choices and provide the voter 4
- 5 with an opportunity to inspect the accessible voter-verified paper audit trail;
- requiring that the accessible voter-verified paper audit trails be preserved at 6
- 7 the polling place in a certain manner for certain purposes; requiring the State
- 8 Board of Elections to conduct a comparison of certain ballots in a random sampling of election districts; requiring that certain polling places have a 9
- certain number of voting systems for certain individuals; requiring a certain 10
- voting system to have the ability to perform certain selections; requiring the 11
- State Board of Elections to adopt certain regulations; providing for the 12 13 application of this Act; requiring the Governor to allocate certain resources;

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 25
- 26 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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1 Article - Election Law

3 (s) (1) "Document ballot" means a ballot used with a voting system in which 4 the voter individually is issued a ballot on which to indicate one or more votes.
5 (2) "Document ballot" includes:
6 (i) a machine-read ballot, such as an optically scanned ballot; and
7 (ii) a hand-counted paper ballot.

9 (A) (1) A VOTING SYSTEM THAT DOES NOT USE A DOCUMENT BALLOT SHALL 10 PRODUCE AN ACCESSIBLE VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT TRAIL THAT SHALL BE 11 MADE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION AND VERIFICATION BY THE VOTER AT THE TIME 12 THE VOTE IS CAST.
13 (2) THE ACCESSIBLE VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT TRAIL SHALL BE 14 PRESERVED WITHIN THE POLLING PLACE IN THE MANNER THAT ALL OTHER 15 DOCUMENT BALLOTS ARE PRESERVED WITHIN THE POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION 16 DAY FOR LATER USE IN ANY MANUAL RECOUNT.
17 (B) A VOTER MAY REVIEW THE ACCESSIBLE VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT 18 TRAIL AND CORRECT ANY ERROR MADE BY THE SYSTEM BEFORE THE ACCESSIBLE 19 VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT TRAIL IS PRESERVED FOR USE IN ANY MANUAL 20 RECOUNT.
21 (C) THE ACCESSIBLE VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT TRAIL PRODUCED 22 UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE AVAILABLE AS AN OFFICIAL 23 RECORD AND SHALL BE THE OFFICIAL RECORD USED FOR ANY RECOUNT 24 CONDUCTED WITH RESPECT TO ANY ELECTION WHEN THE SYSTEM IS USED.
25 (D) IN A RANDOM SAMPLING OF 2% OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF PRECINCTS 26 WITHIN EACH LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT THAT PRODUCE AN ACCESSIBLE 27 VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT TRAIL, THE STATE BOARD SHALL COMPARE THE 28 ACCESSIBLE VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT TRAIL AGAINST THE ELECTRONICALLY 29 RECORDED RESULTS IN THOSE DISTRICTS TO VERIFY THAT THE ELECTRONICALLY 30 RECORDED RESULTS EQUAL THE ACCESSIBLE VOTER-VERIFIED PAPER AUDIT TRAIL.

32 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 33 INDICATED.
34 (2) "ACCESS" MEANS THE ABILITY TO RECEIVE, USE, SELECT, AND 35 MANIPULATE DATA AND OPERATE CONTROLS INCLUDED IN VOTING SYSTEMS.
36 (3) "NONVISUAL" MEANS SYNTHESIZED SPEECH.

- 1 (B) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS GOVERNING ANY VOTING
- 2 SYSTEM USED BY THE STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THAT PROVIDE
- 3 INDIVIDUALS:
- 4 (1) WHO ARE BLIND AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED WITH ACCESS THAT IS
- 5 EQUIVALENT TO THAT PROVIDED TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE NOT BLIND OR
- 6 VISUALLY IMPAIRED; OR
- 7 (2) WHO RESIDE IN A PRECINCT WHERE ANY LIMITED ENGLISH
- 8 PROFICIENT POPULATION CONSTITUTES 3% OF THE OVERALL POPULATION WITHIN
- 9 THE GEOGRAPHIC REGION SERVED BY THAT PRECINCT, WITH ACCESS THAT IS
- 10 EQUIVALENT TO THAT PROVIDED TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE ENGLISH PROFICIENT.
- 11 (C) A VOTING SYSTEM APPROVED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION
- 12 SHALL HAVE THE ABILITY FOR A VOTER TO CAST AND VERIFY ALL SELECTIONS
- 13 MADE BY BOTH VISUAL AND NONVISUAL MEANS.
- 14 (D) (1) AT EACH POLLING PLACE IN THE STATE, AT LEAST ONE VOTING
- 15 SYSTEM APPROVED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL PROVIDE
- 16 ACCESS TO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED.
- 17 (2) AT EACH POLLING PLACE LOCATED IN A PRECINCT WHERE ANY
- 18 LIMITED ENGLISH PROFICIENT POPULATION CONSTITUTES 3% OF THE OVERALL
- 19 POPULATION WITHIN THE GEOGRAPHIC REGION SERVED BY THAT PRECINCT, AT
- 20 LEAST ONE VOTING UNIT APPROVED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION
- 21 SHALL PROVIDE ACCESS IN THE LANGUAGE SPOKEN BY THAT POPULATION.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 1 of this Act shall
- 23 apply to each election occurring on or after June 1, 2006, that is required to be
- 24 conducted in accordance with the Election Law Article.
- 25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor shall
- 26 allocate the resources required to implement the requirements of Section 1 of this Act,
- 27 including any gift received by the State for the purposes of this Act under § 2-201 of
- 28 the State Finance and Procurement Article, or, except for previously committed
- 29 federal funds received by the State to implement the requirements of The Help
- 30 America Vote Act 2002, any federal or other special funds or grant received by the
- 31 State in accordance with federal and State law for the purposes of this Act by fiscal
- 32 year 2007.
