BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 16 **Article - Criminal Law** 17 3-902. 18 (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) "BROADCAST" MEANS THE ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION OF A VISUAL 19 (2) 20 SURVEILLANCE WITH THE INTENT THAT THE SURVEILLANCE BE SEEN BY ANOTHER 21 PERSON. 22 [(2)](3) "Camera" includes any electronic device that can be used 23 surreptitiously to observe an individual. 24 [(3)](i) "Private place" means a room in which a person can 25 reasonably be expected to fully or partially disrobe and has a reasonable expectation 26 of privacy, in:

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(c)

A person may not with prurient intent:

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1 (1) conduct or procure another to conduct visual surveillance of an 2 individual in a private place without the consent of that individual; OR BROADCAST OR PROCURE ANOTHER TO BROADCAST A VISUAL 3 4 SURVEILLANCE OF AN INDIVIDUAL IN A PRIVATE PLACE KNOWING OR HAVING 5 REASON TO KNOW THAT THE SURVEILLANCE WAS CONDUCTED WITHOUT THE 6 CONSENT OF THE INDIVIDUAL. A person who violates SUBSECTION (C)(1) OF this section is guilty of a 7 (d) (1) 8 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or a 9 fine not exceeding \$2,500 or both. A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (C)(2) OF THIS SECTION IS 10 (2) 11 GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT 12 NOT EXCEEDING 3 YEARS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH. 13 (1) An individual who was under visual surveillance in violation of this (e) 14 section has a civil cause of action against any person who conducted or procured 15 another to conduct the visual surveillance. 16 In an action under this subsection, the court may award actual damages and reasonable attorney's fees. 17 18 This section does not affect any legal or equitable right or remedy 19 otherwise provided by law. 20 (g) This section does not affect the application of § 3-901 of this subtitle. 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
