- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- The Chief Judge of the Court for Somerset County shall receive an (1) 18 annual salary of [\$1,900] \$3,800 to be paid quarterly.
- 19 Each of the associate judges of the Court for Somerset County shall 20 receive an annual salary of [\$1,700] \$3,400 to be paid quarterly.
- Each judge shall also receive a daily allowance for traveling expenses 21 (3)
