- 15 (a) The Commission shall require a licensee, and each officer or stockholder of
- 16 a licensee, to disclose to the Commission each financial interest that the person has in
- 17 racing.
- 18 (b) On or before the [75th] 90TH day following the end of a licensee's fiscal
- 19 year, the licensee shall submit to the Commission in the form that the Commission
- 20 requires:
- 21 (1) an itemized statement under oath for the preceding fiscal year of
- 22 receipts from all sources and of all expenses and disbursements, including salaries of
- 23 officers, attorney fees, and lobbying expenses; and
- 24 (2) a certified audit by a certified public accountant of the financial
- 25 records of the licensee for the preceding fiscal year.

- 1 (c) The audited statements of all licensees shall be sent to the Governor, and, 2 subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly.
- 3 (d) The Office of Legislative Audits shall audit each licensee at least once
- 4 every 2 years in accordance with the provisions of §§ 2-1217 through 2-1227 of the
- 5 State Government Article.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 7 effect October 1, 2006.
