12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16	(a) The District Court may end the period of probation at any time.
19	(b) [During the period of probation, on] ON written charges under oath or on violation of a condition of probation, the District Court may issue a warrant or notice requiring the probationer or defendant to be brought or appear before the judge issuing the warrant or notice:

- to answer the charge of violation of conditions of probation or of 21 (1)
- 22 suspension of sentence; and
- 23 (2) to be present for the setting of a hearing date for that charge.
- 24 Pending the hearing or determination of the charge, the District Court
- 25 may remand the probationer or defendant to a correctional facility or release the
- 26 probationer or defendant with or without bail.
