20 21	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

	(a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, if the title or interest of an owner in a registered vehicle passes to another person other than by voluntary transfer:

The registration of the vehicle expires; and

- 1 (2) The vehicle may not be driven on a highway until the person entitled 2 to possession of the vehicle applies for and obtains a new registration of the vehicle. 3 [However, the] THE person entitled to possession of the vehicle, or [his] 4 THE PERSON'S authorized representative, may drive the vehicle on highways in this 5 State for a distance of not more than 200 miles, but only from the place that the 6 person or [his] THE PERSON'S authorized representative obtained possession of the 7 vehicle to the person's place of business, residence, or other place where the vehicle is 8 to be kept.
