- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 (a) (1) The Department annually may issue a complimentary hunter's
- 16 license to the President of the United States, the governor of any state, [any
- 17 Maryland resident who certifies that the resident is a former prisoner of war or 100%
- 18 service connected disabled American veteran,] or an official or an enforcement officer
- 19 of the game and fish management agency of another state which reciprocally offers
- 20 complimentary hunting licenses.
- 21 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ISSUE A LIFETIME COMPLIMENTARY
- 22 HUNTER'S LICENSE TO A MARYLAND RESIDENT WHO CERTIFIES THAT THE
- 23 RESIDENT IS A FORMER PRISONER OF WAR OR 100% SERVICE CONNECTED DISABLED
- 24 AMERICAN VETERAN.
- 25 (3) A complimentary license is not transferable and shall be issued on
- 26 forms designated by the Department.

- 1 (b) For the purposes of this section, "former prisoner of war" means a person 2 who, while serving in the active military, naval, or air service of the United States,
- 3 was forcibly detained or interned in the line of duty by an enemy government or its
- 4 agents, or a hostile force, during a period of armed conflict.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 June 1, 2006.
