A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Family Law - Unregistered Family Day Care Homes and Unlicensed Child**
3 **Care Centers - Penalties**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the criminal penalties for operating an unregistered
5 family day care home; altering the criminal penalties for operating an
6 unlicensed child care center; and generally relating to penalties for operating an
7 unregistered family day care home and unlicensed child care center.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article - Family Law**

21 5-552.

22 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a family day care home may
23 not operate unless it is registered.

24 (b) A family day care home is not required to be registered if the day care
25 provider:

26 (1) is related to each child by blood or marriage;

1 (2) is a friend of each child's parents or legal guardian and the care is
2 provided on an occasional basis; or

3 (3) has received the care of the child from a child placement agency
4 licensed by the Administration or by a local department.

5 (c) A person may not advertise a family day care home or family day care
6 service unless the family day care home is registered under the provisions of this Part
7 V of this subtitle.

8 (d) An employee of the Department charged with the investigation and
9 enforcement of child care regulations may serve a civil citation to a person found in
10 violation of this section.

11 5-557.

12 A person who violates § 5-552 of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on
13 conviction is subject to [a fine not exceeding \$1,000]:

14 (1) A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$2,500 FOR THE FIRST VIOLATION;

15 (2) A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 FOR THE SECOND VIOLATION; AND

16 (3) FOR A THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, IMPRISONMENT NOT
17 EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH.

18 5-574.

19 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this Part VII of this subtitle, a person
20 shall be licensed by the Department before the person may operate a child care center
21 in this State.

22 5-582.

23 Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, a person may not operate a child
24 care center in this State unless licensed by the Department.

25 5-583.

26 A person who violates § 5-574(a) or § 5-582 of this subtitle is guilty of a
27 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to [a fine not exceeding \$1,000]:

28 (1) A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$2,500 FOR THE FIRST VIOLATION;

29 (2) A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 FOR THE SECOND VIOLATION; AND

30 (3) FOR A THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, IMPRISONMENT NOT
31 EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH.

32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
33 October 1, 2006.
