1 AN ACT concerning

2 **St. Mary's County - Impact Fees**

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain authority for St. Mary's County to waive, defer, or
4 amortize certain building impact fees for certain newly constructed dwellings;
5 repealing a certain limit on the total amount of building impact fees that may be
6 waived, deferred, or amortized in any fiscal year; providing that the county shall
7 reflect the total amount of building impact fees waived, deferred, or amortized in
8 the annual capital budget; repealing a provision that terminates, as of a certain
9 date, certain authorization for the county to waive, defer, or provide for the
10 amortization of building impact fees; and generally relating to impact fees on
11 new construction in St. Mary's County.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 25 - County Commissioners

2 10D-1.

3 (a) The County Commissioners of St. Mary's County may raise the building
4 permit fees up to two percent of the cost of any new construction of any living units
5 built in St. Mary's County, or prebuilt and brought into St. Mary's County; the
6 building permit fees shall be set by the County Commissioners in December of each
7 year.

8 (b) (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, the County
9 Commissioners of St. Mary's County may require every person, firm, partnership,
10 corporation, or other legal entity which submits its property plans for approval to the
11 planning commission of St. Mary's County (or the appropriate approving authority) to
12 pay a fixed sum as set by the County Commissioners to defray the additional cost for
13 additional public facilities as required by local ordinance or resolution.

14 (2) By ordinance, the County Commissioners of St. Mary's County may
15 enact an exemption to the building impact fee imposed under paragraph (1) of this
16 subsection for the first 3 lots, in a minor subdivision, that:

17 (i) Were recorded after June 1, 2000 and created from a parcel of
18 record or a lot of record; and

19 (ii) Transferred to a natural, direct lineal descendant, or a legally
20 adopted son, daughter, grandson, or granddaughter.

21 (3) (i) Subject to subparagraphs (ii) and (iii) of this paragraph for each
22 fiscal year, the County Commissioners of St. Mary's County may:

23 1. Waive the building impact fee imposed under paragraph
24 (1) of this subsection for up to [30] 60 newly constructed living units, excluding
25 mobile homes; and

26 2. Defer or provide for the amortization of the building
27 impact fee for up to [50] 70 newly constructed living units, excluding mobile homes.

28 (ii) The County Commissioners may waive, defer, or amortize the
29 building impact fee only for newly constructed living units that are deemed to be
30 affordable for individuals whose family income in the previous fiscal year was less
31 than [50] 60 percent of the county median family income as reported by the U.S.
32 Department of Housing and Urban Development.

33 (iii) [1.] A waiver, deferral, or amortization shall be limited to new
34 construction of living units not exceeding a certain square footage as determined by
35 the County Commissioners of St. Mary's County.

36 [2. The amount of building impact fees waived, deferred, or
37 amortized under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph may not exceed \$350,000 in any
38 fiscal year.]

1 (iv) The total amount of building impact fees waived, deferred, or
2 amortized shall be reflected in the St. Mary's County annual [operating] CAPITAL
3 budget for the fiscal year in which the waiver, deferral, or amortization is granted.

4 (c) The income derived from subsections (a) and (b) shall be used to defray the
5 additional cost to St. Mary's County for additional educational, water, sewerage, road,
6 sanitation, solid waste, park, or similar facilities.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 July 1, 2004. [It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June
10 30, 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
11 abrogated and of no further force and effect.]
