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CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Task Force on Minority Participation in the Environmental Community

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force on Minority Participation in the
- Environmental Community; establishing the membership and staffing of the 4
- 5 Task Force; requiring the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
- to designate the chair of the Task Force; authorizing the Task Force to establish 6
- certain subcommittees; requiring the University System of Maryland to provide 7
- 8 student internships to assist in staffing the Task Force; requiring the Task
- 9 Force to evaluate and make recommendations regarding certain issues;
- requiring the Task Force to submit a report to the Governor and General 10
- 11 Assembly regarding its recommendations by a certain date; prohibiting a
- 12 member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing
- 13 a member of the Task Force to receive certain reimbursements; providing for the
- 14 termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Task Force on Minority
- 15 Participation in the Environmental Community.
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16
- 17 MARYLAND, That:
- There is a Task Force on Minority Participation in the Environmental 18 (a)

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1 The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates (c) 2 shall jointly designate the chair of the Task Force. 3 (d) The Task Force may establish subcommittees as it determines necessary to 4 fulfill its duties. 5 The University System of Maryland and the Department of Natural (e) (1) 6 Resources shall provide staff for the Task Force. 7 The University System of Maryland and the Task Force shall provide 8 opportunities for internships for students to staff the Task Force in exchange for class credit, to the extent practicable. 10 (3)The staff of the Department of Natural Resources shall manage the 11 student intern. 12 (f) A member of the Task Force may not receive compensation for serving on 13 the Task Force but is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard 14 State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 15 The Task Force shall: (g) Evaluate and make recommendations regarding methods of 16 (1) improving minority participation in the environmental community, including: 18 Establishing environmental centers at historically black 19 colleges and universities, such as Morgan State University, Bowie State University, 20 Coppin State University, University of Maryland Eastern Shore, and Sojourner 21 Douglass College, for disseminating information about careers in the environmental 22 arena, implementing environmental education and restoration projects for faculty 23 research, providing opportunities for students to participate in the environmental 24 arena, such as student internships with governmental or nonprofit organizations, and 25 encouraging student participation in community development; 26 Improving communication to minority communities and encouraging community participation on water quality and environmental health 27 issues and other environmental justice issues affecting their communities; and 29 Improving the flow of information and services into minority (iii) 30 communities regarding land conservation in general and protecting natural 31 resources, open space, and land via conservation easements; and 32 Submit a final report of its findings and recommendations to the 33 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before July 1, 2007. 35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 36 July 1, 2006. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the

37 end of July 31, 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this

38 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
