BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 15 **Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings** 16 4-402. In a civil action in which the amount in controversy [exceeds] DOES 17 (e) (1) 18 NOT EXCEED \$10,000, exclusive of attorney's fees if attorney's fees are recoverable by 19 law or contract, a party may NOT demand a jury trial pursuant to the Maryland 20 Rules. 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be 22 construed to apply only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have 23 any effect on or application to any civil action filed before the effective date of this Act. 24 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is contingent

25 on the passage of Chapter \_\_\_\_\_ (S.B. \_\_\_\_/H.B. \_\_\_\_)(6lr1010) of the Acts of the 26 General Assembly of 2006, a Constitutional Amendment, and its ratification by the

27 voters of the State.
