2 Police Officer Protection Act of 2006

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain persons who sell or transfer regulated firearms
- 4 to notify certain purchasers or recipients at the time of purchase or transfer that
- 5 the purchaser or recipient is required to report a lost or stolen regulated firearm
- 6 to a certain law enforcement agency; requiring the owner of a regulated firearm
- 7 to report the loss or theft of the regulated firearm to a certain law enforcement
- 8 agency within a certain period of time after the owner discovers the loss or theft;

- 20 (A) A DEALER OR OTHER PERSON WHO SELLS OR TRANSFERS A REGULATED
- 21 FIREARM SHALL NOTIFY A PURCHASER OR RECIPIENT OF A REGULATED FIREARM AT
- 22 THE TIME OF PURCHASE OR TRANSFER THAT THE PURCHASER OR RECIPIENT IS
- 23 REQUIRED TO REPORT A LOST OR STOLEN REGULATED FIREARM TO THE LOCAL LAW
- 24 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY AS REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION.
- 25 (B) IF A REGULATED FIREARM IS LOST OR STOLEN, THE OWNER OF THE

- 1 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY WITHIN 48 HOURS AFTER THE OWNER FIRST DISCOVERS

- 3 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 4 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 3 YEARS OR A
- 5 FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR BOTH.
