A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Harford County - Alcoholic Beverages - Class BFD (Fine Dining) License

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Liquor Control Board of Harford County to issue
- 4 a special Class BFD (fine dining) on-sale beer, wine and liquor license;
- 5 specifying that the license authorizes the licensee to serve only full-course
- 6 dinners a certain minimum number of days a week; requiring that a restaurant
- 7 with a Class BFD license open for business not later than a certain time and
- 8 comply with certain requirements; providing certain annual fees; requiring the
- 9 Liquor Control Board to adopt certain rules; and generally relating to alcoholic

- 26 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 27 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 2 1-102. In Harford County a "restaurant" as used in § 5-201 AND § 3 (a) (22)(iii) 4 6-201(N)(9) of this article means a business establishment for the accommodation of 5 the public, fully equipped with a proper and adequate dining room, tables, chairs and 6 sufficient facilities for preparing and serving regular meals, as may be approved by 7 the Liquor Control Board. The Board and Department of Health shall approve its 8 sanitary facilities, running hot and cold water, equipment for the proper cleaning of 9 dishes and kitchenware and adequate toilets. At all times there must be sufficient 10 food on the premises for the regular serving of meals, with a proper sign or signs in 11 front of the establishment designating "restaurant" or food and beverages sold, and 12 not advertising any other business. In this establishment the average gross monthly 13 receipts from the sale of foods cooked or prepared and served on the premises where 14 the license is exercised, and other foods, commodities and items defined by the Liquor 15 Control Board, shall exceed 50 percent of the average monthly receipts from the sale 16 of beer and wine, except that a restaurant serving food and beverages whose gross 17 monthly receipts from the sale of food averages \$1,500 or more may not be required to 18 sell food and food commodities in excess of 50 percent of the average monthly receipts 19 from the sale of beer and wine. 20 6-201. 21 (n) (1) This subsection applies only in Harford County. 22 (9)(I) THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD MAY ISSUE A SPECIAL CLASS 23 BFD (FINE DINING) ON-SALE BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE. THE LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE LICENSEE TO SERVE ONLY 24 (II)25 FULL-COURSE DINNERS AT LEAST 5 DAYS A WEEK. 26 (III)A RESTAURANT WITH A CLASS BFD LICENSE MUST OPEN FOR 27 BUSINESS NOT LATER THAN 5 P.M. AND COMPLY WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 28 1-102(A)(22)(III) OF THIS ARTICLE. THE ANNUAL FEES ARE: 29 (IV) \$2,500 FOR A 6-DAY LICENSE, MONDAY THROUGH 30 1. 31 SATURDAY; AND 2. 32 \$2,900 FOR A 7-DAY LICENSE. 33 (V) THE LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD SHALL ADOPT RULES TO CARRY 34 OUT THIS SUBSECTION. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 35 36 June 1, 2006.
