BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 7 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages** 8 1-102. 9 (a) (22)(iii) In Harford County a "restaurant" as used in § 5-201 AND § 10 6-201(N)(9) of this article means a business establishment for the accommodation of 11 the public, fully equipped with a proper and adequate dining room, tables, chairs and 12 sufficient facilities for preparing and serving regular meals, as may be approved by 13 the Liquor Control Board. The Board and Department of Health shall approve its 14 sanitary facilities, running hot and cold water, equipment for the proper cleaning of 15 dishes and kitchenware and adequate toilets. At all times there must be sufficient 16 food on the premises for the regular serving of meals, with a proper sign or signs in 17 front of the establishment designating "restaurant" or food and beverages sold, and 18 not advertising any other business.
