32 INSTEAD OF ANY OTHER PENALTY AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE, A 33 PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF:

- 1 (1) FOR A FIRST VIOLATION, \$500 FOR EACH HORSE BEING
- 2 TRANSPORTED; AND
- 3 (2) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION, \$1,000 FOR EACH HORSE
- 4 BEING TRANSPORTED.
