FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of Six 5 Hundred Sixty-Nine Million, Three Hundred Fifty-Eight Thousand Dollars 6 (\$669,358,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, 7 construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and 8 capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in 9 connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other 10 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the 11 requirement that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds 12 by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds 13 evidencing the loan; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain 14 prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended for other public projects; 15 altering certain requirements for certain programs in certain prior capital 16 budgets and bond loans; providing that the authorizations of State Debt in 17 certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be reduced by certain amounts; 18 providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each project in 19 the capital program; repealing a requirement for a certain appropriation; and 20 generally relating to the financing of certain capital projects. 21
