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## Preamble

15 WHEREAS, Racial and ethnic disparities in health care are widespread across a

16 range of illnesses and health care services even after adjusting for socioeconomic

17 differences; and

18 WHEREAS, The cost of racial and ethnic disparities in health care has a 19 substantial negative economic impact on the State and has increased the demands for

20 medical assistance services; and

21 WHEREAS, The Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities was

22 established using existing resources within the Department of Health and Mental

23 Hygiene, and these limited resources required Department staff to add new tasks to

24 ongoing programs; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 453 of the Acts of 2003 required the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to develop and implement a plan to reduce health care disparities, and funds are needed to finish and implement the plan; and

WHEREAS, There are 37 states with offices of minority health programs, and of the 29 states that are funded, 15 states have at least \$500,000 and 8 states have more than \$1,000,000 for annual operations allowing those states to mount a sustained and coordinated initiative; and

WHEREAS, The population in the State has reached 39.7% minority and theState is projected to be 50% minority by 2010 if current trends continue; and

34 WHEREAS, The General Assembly and the Governor must exercise due

35 diligence in building the infrastructure of the Office of Minority Health and Health

36 Disparities to enable the Office to provide guidance and promote collaboration across

37 the public and private sectors; now, therefore,
