- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21

- 3 CONSTRUCTION TOOLS, AND WINDOWS.
- 4~ (C) "CATASTROPHIC HEALTH EMERGENCY" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN \S 5 14-3A-01(B) OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 6 (D) "CONSUMER GOODS OR SERVICES" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 7 13-101(D) OF THE COMMERCIAL LAW ARTICLE.
- 8 (E) "EMERGENCY SUPPLIES" INCLUDES WATER, FLASHLIGHTS, RADIOS, 9 BATTERIES, CANDLES, BLANKETS, SOAP, DIAPERS, TEMPORARY SHELTERS, TAPE, 10 TOILETRIES, PLYWOOD, NAILS, AND HAMMERS.
- 11 (F) "ESSENTIAL GOODS OR SERVICES" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING 12 UNLESS EXCLUDED BY AN EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR IN CONNECTION
- 13 WITH A STATE OF EMERGENCY:
- 14 (1) FOOD ITEMS;
- 15 (2) CONSUMER GOODS OR SERVICES;
- 16 (3) GOODS OR SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP;
- 17 (4) EMERGENCY SUPPLIES;
- 18 (5) MEDICAL SUPPLIES OR EQUIPMENT;
- 19 (6) HOME HEATING OIL;
- 20 (7) BUILDING MATERIALS;
- 21 (8) HOUSING;
- 22 (9) TRANSPORTATION, FREIGHT, AND STORAGE SERVICES;
- 23 (10) GASOLINE; OR
- 24 (11) OTHER COMMODITIES IMPORTANT TO THE HEALTH, SAFETY, OR
- 25 WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC.
- 26 (G) "FOOD ITEM" MEANS ANY ARTICLE THAT IS USED OR INTENDED FOR USE

- 30 (I) "HOUSING" MEANS RENTAL HOUSING AND INCLUDES HOUSING PROVIDED
- 31 BY A HOTEL OR MOTEL.

- 1 (J) "LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY" MEANS A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY 2 DECLARED UNDER § 14-111 OF THIS TITLE.
- 3 (K) "MEDICAL SUPPLIES OR EQUIPMENT" INCLUDES PRESCRIPTION AND
- 4 NONPRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS, VACCINES, BANDAGES, GAUZE, ISOPROPYL
- 5 ALCOHOL, MEDICAL EQUIPMENT, ANTIVIRAL PRODUCTS, AND ANTIBACTERIAL
- 6 PRODUCTS.
- 7 (L) "REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION SERVICES" MEANS SERVICES PERFORMED
- 8 BY A PERSON FOR REPAIRS TO RESIDENTIAL OR COMMERCIAL PROPERTY THAT IS
- 9 DAMAGED AS A RESULT OF A DISASTER OR TERRORIST ATTACK.
- 10 (M) "STATE OF EMERGENCY" INCLUDES:
- 11 (1) A STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER §
- 12 14-107 OF THIS TITLE;
- 13 (2) A STATE OF EMERGENCY DECLARED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE
- 14 UNITED STATES:
- 15 (3) A RED CONDITION IN THE HOMELAND SECURITY ADVISORY SYSTEM
- 16 OF EITHER THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY OR THE
- 17 MARYLAND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY;
- 18 (4) A CATASTROPHIC HEALTH EMERGENCY PROCLAIMED BY THE
- 19 GOVERNOR UNDER § 14-3A-02 OF THIS TITLE; OR
- 20 (5) A DECLARATION BY AN AGENCY OF THE UNITED STATES
- 21 GOVERNMENT, THE GOVERNOR, THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL

- 25 (N) "TRANSPORTATION, FREIGHT, AND STORAGE SERVICES" MEANS SERVICES
- 26 PERFORMED BY ANY PERSON UNDER A CONTRACT TO MOVE, STORE, OR TRANSPORT
- 27 PERSONAL OR BUSINESS PROPERTY OR RENT EQUIPMENT FOR THOSE PURPOSES.

- 29 (A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, DURING A
- 30 STATE OF EMERGENCY, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR OFFER TO SELL ESSENTIAL
- 31 GOODS OR SERVICES NOT EXCLUDED BY EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR,
- 32 OTHER THAN SERVICES USED FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP, FOR A PRICE OF MORE
- 33 THAN 10% ABOVE THE HIGHEST PRICE AT WHICH THAT PERSON MADE ACTUAL

- 38 SELL OR OFFER TO SELL REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION SERVICES OR SERVICES USED

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- 1 FOR EMERGENCY CLEANUP FOR A PRICE OF MORE THAN 10% ABOVE THE PRICE
- 2 CHARGED BY THAT PERSON FOR THOSE SERVICES IMMEDIATELY PRIOR TO THE
- 3 STATE OF EMERGENCY.
- 4 (C) A PERSON MAY CHARGE A PRICE INCREASE OF MORE THAN 10% IF THE 5 PERSON CAN PROVE THAT:
- 6 (1) THE INCREASE IN PRICE WAS DIRECTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO 7 ADDITIONAL COSTS IMPOSED ON THE PERSON BY THE SUPPLIER OF THE GOODS; OR
- 8 (2) THE INCREASE IN PRICE WAS DIRECTLY ATTRIBUTABLE TO 9 ADDITIONAL COSTS FOR LABOR OR MATERIALS USED TO PROVIDE THE SERVICES; 10 AND
- 11 (3) THE PRICE REPRESENTS NO MORE THAN 10% ABOVE THE TOTAL
- 12 COST TO THE SELLER PLUS THE MARKUP CUSTOMARILY APPLIED BY THE SELLER
- 13 FOR THAT GOOD OR SERVICE IN THE USUAL COURSE OF BUSINESS IMMEDIATELY
- 14 PRIOR TO THE ONSET OF THE STATE OF EMERGENCY.
- 15 (D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 16 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 1 YEAR OR A
- 17 FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR BOTH.
- 18 (E) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MAY BE EXTENDED FOR ADDITIONAL
- 19 30-DAY PERIODS BY THE PRINCIPAL EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF A POLITICAL
- 20 SUBDIVISION OR THE GOVERNOR IF DETERMINED TO BE NECESSARY TO PROTECT
- 21 THE LIVES, PROPERTY, OR WELFARE OF THE CITIZENS.

- 23 A SALE OR OFFER FOR SALE OF CONSUMER GOODS OR SERVICES THAT
