SECTION 4. <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2006. <u>It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years and, at the end of September 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.</u>
