## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## Maryland Commission for Men

3 FOR the purpose of creating the Maryland Commission for Men; providing for the 4 appointment of members of the Commission; requiring that certain members of 5 the Commission shall be appointed from among applicants who have been 6 nominated and recommended for appointment by certain organizations; 7 requiring that certain members of the Commission shall be appointed from 8 applicants applying on their own behalf; providing for the terms of the members 9 of the Commission; providing for reimbursement for certain expenses of 10 members; providing that a commissioner who fails to attend a certain number of 11 meetings during a certain time period is considered to have resigned; providing 12 that the Commission is a unit of the Department of Human Resources; requiring 13 the members of the Commission to elect a chair and vice chair; requiring the 14 Secretary of Human Resources to appoint an executive director; providing that 15 the executive director is a merit employee of the Department and is entitled to a 16 certain salary; providing for the duties of the Commission; authorizing the 17 Commission to accept certain funds under certain circumstances; requiring the 18 Commission to report annually to the Governor and the General Assembly; 19 defining certain terms; providing for staggered terms for certain members of the 20 Commission; requiring, to the extent practicable, that the appointments to the 21 Commission ensure geographic diversity; requiring the appointments to the 22 Commission to be made without regard to race, color, disability, gender, religion, 23 age, or national origin; and generally relating to the Maryland Commission for 24 Men.

    WHEREAS, There is a silent health crisis affecting the health and well-being of 3 Maryland men; and

4 WHEREAS, This health crisis is of particular concern to men, but is also a 5 concern for women, as the crisis affects fathers, husbands, sons, and brothers; and

6 WHEREAS, Men's health is likewise a concern for employers, who lose 7 productive employees as well as pay the costs of medical care, and for State 8 government and society, which absorb the enormous costs of premature death and 9 disability, including the costs of caring for dependents left without income; and

10 WHEREAS, The life expectancy for a child born in Maryland in 2001 was 73.9 11 years for males versus 79.1 years for females; and

12 WHEREAS, The 2001 Maryland death rate of 819.9 per 100,000 population for 13 men exceeded the death rate of 802.4 per 100,000 population for women; and

4 WHEREAS, In Maryland, only $22 \%$ of the deaths to women in 2001 occurred 5 before age 65 , men younger than 65 accounted for $36 \%$ of all deaths to men in that year; and

WHEREAS, Men comprised 60\% of new HIV cases in 2001 in Maryland and 67\% of new AIDS cases in the same year; and

WHEREAS, Men are reported to be $25 \%$ less likely than women to visit a doctor; and

WHEREAS, Employment-based health insurance, which has traditionally financed much of the health care received by men, is on the decline, and recent Medicaid and other publicly-financed health care expansions have focused primarily on children and women; and

WHEREAS, Educating men, their families, and health care providers about the importance of early detection of men's health problems can result in reducing rates of mortality for male-specific diseases, as well as improve the health of Maryland men and the State's overall economic well-being; and

WHEREAS, Regular exercise, good nutrition, healthy behaviors, regular medical checkups, preventive health screenings, and diagnostic tests that detect disease early have been proven to save lives; and

WHEREAS, A Commission for Men is needed to promote men's health in Maryland; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

26 (2) that appointments are made without regard to the race, color, 27 disability, gender, religion, age, or national origin of the appointees.
