22 23	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

26	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
27	(2) "Child who is blind or visually impaired" means a child who:
	(i) Has a visual acuity of 20/200 or less in the better eye with correcting lenses or has a limited field of vision so that the widest diameter of the visual field subtends an angle no greater than 20 degrees;
31	(ii) Has a medically indicated expectation of visual deterioration; or
	(iii) Has a medically diagnosed limitation in visual functioning that restricts the child's ability to read and write standard print at levels expected of other children of comparable ability and grade level.

- 17 (8) "SPECIALIZED FORMATS" MEANS BRAILLE, LARGE PRINT, AUDIO, OR
- 18 DIGITAL TEXT THAT IS EXCLUSIVELY FOR USE USED BY BLIND OR OTHER
- 19 INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES VISUALLY IMPAIRED INDIVIDUALS.
- 20 (b) (1) In developing the individualized education program for a child who is
- 21 blind or visually impaired, provisions shall be made for instruction in braille and the
- 22 use of braille unless the IEP team determines, after an evaluation of the child's
- 23 reading and writing skills, needs, and appropriate reading and writing media,
- 24 including an evaluation of the child's future needs for instruction in braille or the use
- 25 of braille, that such instruction or use is not appropriate for the child.
- 26 (2) A child may not be denied the opportunity for instruction in braille
- 27 reading and writing solely because the child has some remaining vision.
- 28 (3) This section does not require the exclusive use of braille if other
- 29 reading and writing media are appropriate to the child's educational needs. The use of
- 30 other reading and writing media does not preclude the use of braille or the instruction
- 31 of braille.
- 32 (c) For the purpose of achieving successful implementation of this section, the
- 33 State Board and the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board shall adopt
