

(b) 5 To qualify for a license to practice dentistry, the applicant shall be at least (c) 6 18 years old. 7 Unless waived by the Board under §§ 4-303 and 4-303.1 of this subtitle, to (d) 8 qualify for a license to practice dentistry, the applicant shall hold a degree of Doctor of 9 Dental Surgery, Doctor of Dental Medicine, or the equivalent, from a college or 10 university that is: 11 (1) Authorized by any state or any province of Canada to grant the 12 degree; and 13 Recognized by the Board as requiring adequate preprofessional 14 collegiate training and as maintaining an acceptable course of dental instruction. To qualify for a license to practice dental hygiene, the applicant shall be a 15 graduate of a school for dental hygienists that: 16 17 (1) Requires at least 2 years of education in an institution of higher 18 education; 19 (2) Is accredited by the American Dental Association Commission on 20 Dental Accreditation; and 21 (3) Is approved by the Board. 22 (f) Unless the examination requirement is waived under § 4-306 or § (1)23 4-310 of this subtitle, and except as provided in § 4-303.1 of this subtitle, to qualify 24 for a general license to practice dentistry or a general license to practice dental 25 hygiene, the applicant shall pass an examination given by the Board under this 26 subtitle. 27 An examination is not required for a teacher's license to practice 28 dentistry, a limited license to practice dentistry, or a teacher's license to practice 29 dental hygiene. 30 In addition to the requirements of subsections (a), (b), (c), and (d) of this

Be licensed to practice dentistry in any other state;

Have been active in the dental profession for at least 5 years;



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
