| 14 (1) assess the impact of the current rates on: |
| 15(i)participation of existing and potential therapeutic behavioral16services providers in the Maryland Medical Assistance Program; |
| 17 (ii) the ability of therapeutic behavioral services providers to 18 recruit and retain staff; |
| 19 (iii) the ability of <u>MAPS MD</u> <u>the Department</u> to promptly refer a 20 child for receipt of therapeutic behavioral services; and |

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1 (iv) the ability of therapeutic behavioral services providers to 2 deliver the requisite number of therapeutic behavioral services hours;

3 (2) take into account the impact of current rates on outcomes of care for 4 children in need of therapeutic behavioral services; and

5 (3) be conducted jointly by staff from the Maryland Medical Assistance 6 Program and the Mental Hygiene Administration.

7 (c) In conducting the study, the Department shall:

8 (1) provide public notice of the study in the Maryland Register; and

9 (2) solicit input from therapeutic behavioral services providers, mental 10 health professionals, advocates, and families whose children have received or been 11 referred for therapeutic behavioral services.

12 (d) On or before January 1, 2007, the Department shall submit a report to the

13 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the
