- 22 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person driving or
- 23 otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave it unattended until the engine is
- 24 stopped, the ignition locked, the key removed, and the brake effectively set.
- 25 (b) A person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave
- 26 the motor vehicle unattended until, if the vehicle is on a grade, the front wheels are
- 27 turned to the curb or side of the highway.
