- 17 WHEREAS, Maryland is a leader in establishing innovative educational

- WHEREAS, Maryland continues to experience significant teacher shortages,

- 14 (I) THE SHORTAGE OF TEACHERS IN SCIENCE, MATHEMATICS, 15 AND SPECIAL EDUCATION IN A SCHOOL SYSTEM;
- 16 (II) THE PERCENTAGE OF CONDITIONAL TEACHERS IN A SCHOOL 17 SYSTEM; AND
- 18 (III) GEOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY.
- 19 (3) SUBJECT TO THE AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS, EACH FISCAL YEAR THE 20 DEPARTMENT SHALL DESIGNATE THE NUMBER OF QUALIFIED CANDIDATES IN EACH 21 LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM THAT MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM.
- 22 (4) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF QUALIFIED CANDIDATES THAT MAY 23 PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM STATEWIDE MAY NOT EXCEED 450 100 IN ANY FISCAL 24 YEAR.
- 25 (D) (1) THE DEPARTMENT AND THE COUNTY BOARD SHALL SHARE IN THE 26 COST OF PROVIDING A PER DIEM STIPEND TO AN ELIGIBLE QUALIFIED CANDIDATE 27 WHO PARTICIPATES IN A PRERESIDENCY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM.
- 28 (2) THE DEPARTMENT'S SHARE OF THE PER DIEM STIPEND SHALL BE NO 29 MORE THAN 50% OF A LOCAL SCHOOL SYSTEM'S LONG-TERM DEGREED SUBSTITUTE 30 PER DIEM RATE, FOR A MAXIMUM OF 40 DAYS.
- 31 (E) STATE FUNDS PROVIDED UNDER THIS PROGRAM SHALL SUPPLEMENT 32 AND MAY NOT SUPPLANT LOCAL FUNDING PROVIDED FOR THE SAME PURPOSE.
- 33 (F) ON OCTOBER 1, 2008, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT
- 34 SHALL SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE
- 35 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, A REPORT REGARDING:

- 3 (2) THE TEACHING ASSIGNMENTS OF RESIDENT TEACHERS 4 PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAM; AND
- 5 (3) THE RETENTION RATE OF RESIDENT TEACHERS PARTICIPATING IN 6 THE PROGRAM DURING THEIR FIRST 5 YEARS OF TEACHING.
