6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

10 (a) In this section, "Program" means the Maryland Medbank Program 11 established under this section.

12 (b) There is a Maryland Medbank Program.

13 (c) The purpose of the Program is to improve the health status of individuals 14 throughout the State who lack prescription drug coverage by providing access to 15 medically necessary prescription drugs through patient assistance programs

16 sponsored by pharmaceutical drug manufacturers.

17 (d) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Program shall be 18 administered by the Medbank of Maryland, Inc.

19(2)The Medbank of Maryland, Inc. shall contract with one or more20government or nonprofit entities to operate the Program.

21(e)(1)The Program shall be funded through a grant provided by the22Department.

23 (2) Program funds may be used in part to:

24 (i) Purchase interim supplies of prescription drugs for enrollees 25 who have applied to participate in a manufacturer's patient assistance program but 26 have not not reactived the approved prescription drugs and

26 have not yet received the approved prescription drug; and

27 (ii) Distribute medication to enrollees who have been approved to28 participate in a manufacturer's patient assistance program.

29 (f) (1) The Medbank of Maryland, Inc. shall ensure that the Program is 30 available to residents in each of the following geographic regions of the State:

- 31 (i) Western Maryland;
- 32 (ii) The Eastern Shore;
