2 **Health - Maryland Medbank Program - Sunset Repeal**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing a certain termination provision relating to the  
4 Maryland Medbank Program; and generally relating to the Maryland Medbank  
5 Program.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 **Article - Health - General**

9 15-124.2.

10 (a) In this section, "Program" means the Maryland Medbank Program  
11 established under this section.

12 (b) There is a Maryland Medbank Program.

13 (c) The purpose of the Program is to improve the health status of individuals  
14 throughout the State who lack prescription drug coverage by providing access to  
15 medically necessary prescription drugs through patient assistance programs  
16 sponsored by pharmaceutical drug manufacturers.

17 (d) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, the Program shall be  
18 administered by the Medbank of Maryland, Inc.

19 (2) The Medbank of Maryland, Inc. shall contract with one or more  
20 government or nonprofit entities to operate the Program.

21 (e) (1) The Program shall be funded through a grant provided by the  
22 Department.

23 (2) Program funds may be used in part to:

24 (i) Purchase interim supplies of prescription drugs for enrollees  
25 who have applied to participate in a manufacturer's patient assistance program but  
26 have not yet received the approved prescription drug; and

27 (ii) Distribute medication to enrollees who have been approved to  
28 participate in a manufacturer's patient assistance program.

29 (f) (1) The Medbank of Maryland, Inc. shall ensure that the Program is  
30 available to residents in each of the following geographic regions of the State:

31 (i) Western Maryland;

32 (ii) The Eastern Shore;

33 (iii) The Baltimore metropolitan area;

1 (iv) The Maryland counties in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan  
2 area; and

3 (v) Southern Maryland, including Anne Arundel County.

4 (2) Medbank of Maryland, Inc. shall be the central coordinating office for  
5 the State.

6 (g) Eligibility for the Program shall be limited only by the criteria established  
7 by pharmaceutical manufacturers for their patient assistance programs.

8 (h) (1) The Department shall require detailed financial reports at least  
9 quarterly from Medbank of Maryland, Inc.

10 (2) The Medbank of Maryland, Inc. shall release funds to the entities  
11 that operate the Program as needed and justified by the quarterly reports filed in  
12 accordance with paragraph (1) of this subsection.

13 (i) On or before December 1, 2001, and annually thereafter, the Department  
14 and Medbank of Maryland, Inc. shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with  
15 § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly, on the status of  
16 the Maryland Medbank Program established under this section, including:

17 (1) The number and demographic characteristics of the State residents  
18 served by the Program;

19 (2) The types and retail value of prescription drugs accessed through the  
20 Program;

21 (3) The nature and extent of outreach performed to inform State  
22 residents of the assistance available through the Program; and

23 (4) The total volume and retail value of each brand name drug, by  
24 manufacturer, accessed through the Program.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
27 June 1, 2003. [Section 15-124.2 of the Health - General Article as enacted by this Act  
28 shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and 1 month and, at the end of June 30,  
29 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, § 15-124.2 of the  
30 Health - General Article as enacted by this Act shall be abrogated and of no further  
31 force and effect.]
