- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 25 roadway shall ride as near to the right side of the roadway as practicable and safe,

- 1 When reasonably necessary to leave the bike lane or shoulder (iv) 2 because the bike lane or shoulder is overlaid with a right turn lane, merge lane, or 3 other marking that breaks the continuity of the bike lane or shoulder. A bicycle or bicyclist may be equipped with a FUNCTIONING lamp 27 (2) 28 that ACTS AS A REFLECTOR AND emits a red light or a flashing amber light visible 29 from a distance of 500 feet to the rear INSTEAD OF OR in addition to the red reflector 30 required by paragraph (1) of this subsection. [A] SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A person may [not] 31 32 operate a bicycle or a motor scooter [unless it is] THAT IS equipped with a bell or 33 other device capable of giving a signal audible for a distance of at least 100 feet. [However, a] A bicycle or motor scooter may not be equipped with nor may 34 35 any person use on a bicycle any siren or whistle.

- 37 enables its operator to make the braked wheels skid] BRAKING SYSTEM CAPABLE OF

- $1\,$ STOPPING FROM A SPEED OF 10 MILES PER HOUR WITHIN 15 FEET on dry, level, clean
