- 25 (O) A RECIPIENT MAY HOLD A WORKFORCE SHORTAGE STUDENT ASSISTANCE
- 26 GRANT AND ANY OTHER STATE GRANT OR SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED BY THE OFFICE
- 27 PROVIDED THAT THE TOTAL OF ALL GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS DOES NOT EXCEED:
- 28 (1) THE STUDENT'S TOTAL COST OF ATTENDANCE, AS CERTIFIED BY
- 29 THE INSTITUTION WHERE THE STUDENT IS ENROLLED; AND

- 32 (P) FUNDS FOR THE WORKFORCE SHORTAGE STUDENT ASSISTANCE GRANT
- 33 PROGRAM SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF THE COMMISSION BY
- 34 THE GOVERNOR.
- 35 (Q) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT GUIDELINES OR REGULATIONS
- 36 NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION.

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- 1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Office of Student
- 2 Financial Assistance in the Maryland Higher Education Commission may not award
- 3 an initial scholarship or grant under the student financial assistance programs
