A RECIPIENT MAY HOLD A WORKFORCE SHORTAGE STUDENT ASSISTANCE 16 17 GRANT AND ANY OTHER STATE GRANT OR SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED BY THE OFFICE PROVIDED THAT THE TOTAL OF ALL GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS DOES NOT EXCEED: 19 THE STUDENT'S TOTAL COST OF ATTENDANCE, AS CERTIFIED BY (1)20 THE INSTITUTION WHERE THE STUDENT IS ENROLLED; AND 21 (2) THE COST OF ATTENDANCE, AS DEFINED IN SUBSECTION (I) OF THIS 22 SECTION. 23 (P) FUNDS FOR THE WORKFORCE SHORTAGE STUDENT ASSISTANCE GRANT 24 PROGRAM SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET OF THE COMMISSION BY 25 THE GOVERNOR. THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT GUIDELINES OR REGULATIONS 26 (O) 27 NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION. 28 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Office of Student 29 Financial Assistance in the Maryland Higher Education Commission may not award 30 an initial scholarship or grant under the student financial assistance programs 31 specified in Section 1 of this Act after June 30, 2007. The office may renew a 32 scholarship or grant after June 30, 2007, if the individual received an initial 33 scholarship or grant before that date. 34 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
