# 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 **Business Occupations and Professions - Lawyers - Retainer Agreements** 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a lawyer from requiring a person to sign a retainer 4 agreement that requires the person to reimburse the lawyer for attorney's fees 5 in the event of a future dispute between the person and the lawyer unless the person provides to the lawyer a certain statement; defining a certain term; and 6 generally relating to lawyer retainer agreements. 7 8 BY adding to Article - Business Occupations and Professions 9 Section 10-503 10 11 Annotated Code of Maryland 12 (2004 Replacement Volume and 2005 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 15 **Article - Business Occupations and Professions** 16 10-503. IN THIS SECTION, "RETAINER AGREEMENT" MEANS A WRITTEN 17 (A) 18 AGREEMENT IN WHICH A LAWYER AGREES TO REPRESENT ANOTHER PERSON. 19 (B) A LAWYER MAY NOT REQUIRE A PERSON TO SIGN A RETAINER 20 AGREEMENT THAT PROVIDES THAT THE PERSON SEEKING REPRESENTATION MUST 21 REIMBURSE THE LAWYER FOR ATTORNEY'S FEES IN THE EVENT OF A FUTURE 22 DISPUTE BETWEEN THE PERSON AND THE LAWYER UNLESS THE PERSON PROVIDES 23 THE LAWYER WITH A WRITTEN STATEMENT FROM AN INDEPENDENT LAWYER 24 ATTESTING TO THE FACT THAT THE PERSON WAS ADVISED BY THE INDEPENDENT 25 LAWYER OF THE MEANING AND RAMIFICATIONS OF THE REIMBURSEMENT

26 PROVISION OF THE RETAINER AGREEMENT.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2006.
