A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning		

2 Task Force to Study Uncompensated Health Care in Maryland

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Uncompensated Health Care
- 4 in Maryland; providing for the composition of the Task Force; requiring the
- 5 Governor to designate the chair of the Task Force; providing for the staffing of
- 6 the Task Force; prohibiting a member from receiving certain compensation;
- 7 authorizing a member to receive certain reimbursement; establishing the duties
- 8 of the Task Force; requiring the Task Force to report its findings to the Governor
- 9 and the General Assembly by a certain date; providing for the termination of
- this Act; and generally relating to a Task Force to Study Uncompensated Health
- 11 Care in Maryland.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That:
- 14 (a) There is a Task Force to Study Uncompensated Health Care in Maryland.
- 15 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 16 (1) five members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President
- 17 of the Senate;
- 18 (2) five members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of
- 19 the House;
- 20 (3) the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene, or the Secretary's
- 21 designee;
- 22 (4) five members, appointed by the Governor, who are experts in the
- 23 field of health care policy; and
- 24 (5) five consumer members, appointed by the Governor.
- 25 (c) The Governor shall designate the chair of the Task Force.
- 26 (d) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Department of
- 27 Legislative Services shall provide staff for the Task Force.

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- 1 (e) A member of the Task Force: 2 (1) may not receive compensation; but 3 (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State 4 Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget. 5 (f) The Task Force shall: study the impact of uncompensated health care on health care 6 (1) 7 providers in the State; study the effect of uncompensated health care on the cost of health (2) 9 care in the State; ascertain the amount and cost of services that health care 11 practitioners and institutions provide to uninsured individuals; and
- 12 (4) make recommendations regarding legislation to address problems 13 documented by the Task Force.
- 14 (g) The Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the 15 Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the 16 General Assembly, on or before October 1, 2006.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 July 1, 2006. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 19 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 20 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
