## 2 Minimum Wage - Implementation of Increased Minimum Wage

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain employers to delay the payment of a certain
- 4 minimum wage rate and tip credit for a certain number of days after the
- 5 effective date of a certain Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and
- 6 generally relating to the payment of wages.

7 Preamble

- 8 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland overrode the Governor's veto of
- 9 House Bill 391 of the 2005 Session, which increased the State's minimum wage rate
- 10 and tip credit, on January 17, 2006; and
- 11 WHEREAS, As a result of the veto override, House Bill 391 of the 2005 Session
- 12 was enacted as Chapter 2 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2006 on January 17,
- 13 2006; and
- WHEREAS, Chapter 2 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2006 is to take
- 15 effect on February 16, 2006; and
- WHEREAS, The 30-day notice of the effective date of the new minimum wage
- 17 rate and tip credit established by Chapter 2 of the Acts of the General Assembly of
- 18 2006 hinders the ability of State employers to implement the provisions of Chapter 2
- 19 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2006 in a timely manner; now, therefore,
- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That, notwithstanding Chapter 2 of the Acts of 2006, an employer may
- 22 delay the payment of the minimum wage rate and tip credit established by Chapter 2
- 23 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2006 for not more than 10 days after the
- 24 effective date of Chapter 2 of the Acts of 2006.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
- 26 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
- 27 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
- 28 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
- 29 the date it is enacted.
