A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Hospitals - Certificate of Need and Rate-Setting - High Performance**
3 **Buildings**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Health Care Commission to adopt rules
5 and regulations for certification of need that provide consideration for hospital
6 projects that incorporate the requirements for a high performance building;
7 requiring the Health Services Cost Review Commission, in the determination of
8 reasonable rates for each facility, to take into account the costs of hospital
9 projects that incorporate the requirements for a high performance building; and
10 generally relating to consideration for high performance buildings in hospital
11 certificate of need and rate-setting decisions.

22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

24 **Article - Health - General**

26 (c) (1) The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations for applying for
27 and issuing certificates of need.

1 (2) THE RULES AND REGULATIONS SHALL PROVIDE CONSIDERATION
2 FOR HOSPITAL PROJECTS THAT INCORPORATE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR A HIGH
3 PERFORMANCE BUILDING, AS DEFINED IN § 3-602(D)(1)(I) OF THE STATE FINANCE
4 AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

6 (e) In the determination of reasonable rates for each facility, as specified in
7 this section, the Commission shall take into account:

8 (1) [all] ALL of the cost of complying with recommendations made,
9 under Subtitle 1 of this title, on comprehensive health planning; AND

10 (2) THE COSTS OF HOSPITAL PROJECTS THAT INCORPORATE THE
11 REQUIREMENTS FOR A HIGH PERFORMANCE BUILDING, AS DEFINED IN §
12 3-602(D)(1)(I) OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

15 (d) (1) (i) In this paragraph, "high performance building" means a
16 building that:

17 1. achieves at least a silver rating according to the U.S.
18 Green Building Council's LEED (leadership in energy and environmental design)
19 Green Building Rating System as adopted in 2001 or subsequently by the Maryland
20 Green Building Council;

21 2. achieves at least a two globe rating according to the Green
22 Globes Program as adopted by the Green Building Initiative;

23 3. achieves at least a comparable numeric rating according to
24 a nationally recognized, accepted, and appropriate numeric sustainable development
25 rating system, guideline, or standard; or

26 4. meets nationally recognized, consensus-based, and
27 accepted green building guidelines, standards, or systems approved by the State.

28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
29 October 1, 2006.
