- WHEREAS, The economy of Maryland requires an educated workforce to be
- 13 competitive with other states; and
- WHEREAS, Almost 1,000,000 out-of-school youth and adults need a high school
- 15 diploma, need to learn to communicate in English, or need to improve basic literacy

- WHEREAS, The State Assessment of Adult Literacy, published by the American
- 18 Institutes for Research in December 2005, reported 1,500,000 Maryland adults with

- WHEREAS, Maryland provides adult education and literacy services to only 3%
