A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Trauma Physician Services Fund - Reimbursement Rates - Grants

- 3 FOR the purpose of increasing the reimbursement rate for the cost incurred by
- 4 certain trauma centers to maintain trauma physicians on-call; increasing the
- 5 total amount of reimbursements made to certain emergency physicians from the
- 6 Maryland Trauma Physician Services Fund; requiring the Health Services Cost
- Review Commission to develop guidelines for the approval of a certain grant to
- 8 subsidize stand-by costs for certain out-of-state pediatric trauma centers;
- 9 requiring the Commission to issue a certain grant to the Curtis National Hand
- 10 Center at Union Memorial Hospital to subsidize on-call services; requiring the
- Curtis National Hand Center to comply with certain reporting requirements;
- 12 altering certain definitions; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the
- 13 Maryland Trauma Physician Services Fund.

- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Health Services Cost
- 9 Review Commission shall develop guidelines for the approval of an annual grant from
- 10 the Maryland Trauma Physician Services Fund under § 19-130 of the Health -
- 11 General Article of up to \$590,000 to subsidize the stand-by costs for an out-of-state
- 12 pediatric trauma center that has entered into an agreement with the Maryland
- 13 Institute for Emergency Services Systems.
- 14 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Health Services Cost
- 15 Review Commission shall issue a onetime grant from the Maryland Trauma
- 16 Physician Services Fund under § 19-130 of the Health General Article for up to
- 17 \$300,000 to subsidize on-call services for the Curtis National Hand Center at Union
- 18 Memorial Hospital. The Curtis National Hand Center at Union Memorial Hospital
- 19 shall comply with the reporting requirements under § 19-130(d)(6) of the Health -
- 20 General Article.
- 21 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 October 1, 2006.
