20 (a) This section does not apply to the disposition of a body by a school of 21 medicine or dentistry.

22 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person may not cremate a 23 body until it has been identified by:

24 (1) The next of kin;

25 (2) A person who is authorized to arrange for final disposition of the body 26 under §§ 5-508 through 5-512 of this subtitle; or

27 (3) A medical examiner.

28 (c) If a person who is authorized to arrange for final disposition of a body is

29 not available to identify the body and authorize cremation, that person may delegate

 $30\,$  that authority to another person by sending to the delegate [a telegram] AN

31 ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION that contains the name, address, and relationship of

32 the sender to the deceased and the name and address of the individual to whom

33 authority is delegated. Written authorization shall follow by mail but does not take

34 precedence over the [telegram] ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION authorizing the

35 identification and cremation.
