BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 19 **Article - Natural Resources** 20 4-11A-02. 21 (a) (1) The Department shall promulgate by regulation requirements that 22 are necessary to ensure that aquaculture operations do not adversely impact wild 23 stocks of fish, including measures for identifying fish as products of an aquaculture

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- 1 operation. In developing these regulations, the Department shall consult with the
- 2 Aquaculture Coordinating Council, established by § 10-1303 of the Agriculture
- 3 Article, and incorporate in the regulations public notice provisions in accordance with
- 4 § 4-11A-06 of this subtitle.
- 5 (2) The Department may not issue a permit for the raising of nonnative
- 6 species, including hybrids of striped bass, or nonnative stocks unless:
- 7 (i) The permit limits the aquaculture operation to nontidal ponds,
- 8 lakes, or impoundments; and
- 9 (ii) The aquaculture operation is constructed in a manner that
- 10 assures that nonnative stocks are precluded from entering the tidal waters or
- 11 contaminating the native species of the State.
- 12 (b) A person may not engage in aquaculture unless the person has obtained a
- 13 permit from the Department. The permit shall be conditioned upon the person
- 14 complying with the regulations promulgated under subsection (a) of this section.
- 15 (c) A permittee under this section shall allow the Department to inspect at
- 16 reasonable hours any facilities, equipment, or fish involved in the permittee's
- 17 aquaculture operations.
- 18 (d) Except as otherwise provided by law or by regulations adopted by the
- 19 Department, all provisions of this title and regulations adopted under this title
- 20 applicable to the taking, possession, sale, and transport of finfish do not apply to
- 21 finfish that are in or from aquaculture operations in nontidal ponds, lakes, or
- 22 impoundments.

- 31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 32 (a) the Aquaculture Coordinating Council established under § 10-1303 of the
- 33 Agriculture Article shall investigate and provide recommendations to the Department
- 34 of Natural Resources by December 31, 2006, on:
- 35 (1) the establishment of areas for shellfish seed production, sale, and use
- 36 in accordance with the United States Food and Drug Administration's National
- 37 Shellfish Sanitation Program guidelines; and
