Preamble

11 WHEREAS, The Maryland State Flag was officially adopted as our State Flag 12 by the General Assembly on March 9, 1904; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland State Flag is the most unique and arguably the mostbeautiful of all state flags;

WHEREAS, The Maryland State Flag features four panels with two designsthat represent the coat-of-arms of Lord Calvert's family; and

WHEREAS, The yellow and black design came from Lord Calvert's father's side,the Calvert family, while the red and white cross design came from his mother's side,the Crosslands; and

20 WHEREAS, During the Civil War, the Union soldiers who fought from

21 Maryland flew the yellow and black banner while the Confederate soldiers from

22 Maryland flew the red and white cross banner, which became known as the

23 "Maryland Cross"; and

24 WHEREAS, After the Civil War, Maryland's Fifth Regiment Armory, which was

25 composed of veterans from the North and the South, adopted a combination banner

26 honoring all those who fought from Maryland. This emblem, resembling the

Maryland State Seal, is still used as the insignia for the Maryland National Guard;
and

3 WHEREAS, Because the State Flag does not have a distinct top or bottom, it is 4 common to see the flag flown incorrectly; and

5 WHEREAS, An annual Maryland Flag Day would promote education on the 6 history of the flag and how it should be flown; and

7 WHEREAS, An annual Maryland Flag Day would also promote the display of8 this beautiful banner; and

9 WHEREAS, There is no other symbol that symbolizes Maryland more than the 10 State Flag; and

WHEREAS, Governor Ehrlich proclaimed March 9, 2004, Maryland Flag Day tocelebrate the centennial of our State Flag; now, therefore,

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (A) THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM MARCH 9 AS MARYLAND 18 FLAG DAY.

19 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL:

20(1)ENCOURAGE ALL CITIZENS OF MARYLAND TO DISPLAY THE21MARYLAND STATE FLAG ON THE OUTSIDE OF THEIR HOMES AND BUSINESSES; AND

22 (2) ENCOURAGE MARYLAND'S PUBLIC SCHOOLS TO:

23 (I) FLY THE STATE FLAG EACH DAY; AND

24 (II) TEACH STUDENTS ABOUT THE HISTORY OF THE STATE FLAG 25 AND HOW IT SHOULD BE FLOWN.
