A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Electric Utility Regulation - Standard Offer Service - Total Rates

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an electric company in any year in which the electric

- 4 company has an obligation to provide standard offer service under a Public
- 5 Service Commission order from increasing the rate for electricity charged to
- 6 residential customers by more than a certain percent; allowing an electric
- 7 company to recover the portion of the total rate that exceeds a certain limit
- 8 through a standard offer service transition charge over a certain period;
- 9 prohibiting a certain charge from being included in a determination of whether
- 10 an electric company's increase in the total rate in any year exceeds a certain
- 11 limit; requiring that a certain rate increase be included in a determination of
- 12 whether an electric company's increase in the total rate in any year exceeds a
- 13 certain limit; requiring the Commission, by regulation or order, to adopt certain
- 14 procedures; prohibiting the Commission from allowing the recovery of more
- 15 than a certain portion of the standard offer service transition charge in any 1
- 16 year; requiring the standard offer service transition charge to be separately
- 17 stated on bills to customers; and generally relating to the electric utility
- 18 regulation, standard offer service, and rates.

24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 7-510.1.

3 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "STANDARD OFFER SERVICE TRANSITION CHARGE"
4 MEANS THE RATE OR CHARGE AUTHORIZED BY THE COMMISSION FOR THE
5 RECOVERY OF STANDARD OFFER SERVICE COSTS UNDER THIS SECTION.

6 (B) IN ANY YEAR IN WHICH AN ELECTRIC COMPANY HAS AN OBLIGATION TO
7 PROVIDE STANDARD OFFER SERVICE UNDER A COMMISSION ORDER, THE ELECTRIC
8 COMPANY MAY NOT CHARGE RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS A TOTAL RATE FOR
9 ELECTRICITY THAT EXCEEDS THE PREVIOUS YEAR'S RATE BY MORE THAN 5%.

(C) IN ANY YEAR IN WHICH AN ELECTRIC COMPANY IS PROHIBITED FROM
 INCREASING THE TOTAL RATE TO RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS BY MORE THAN 5%, THE
 ELECTRIC COMPANY MAY RECOVER FROM RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS THE PORTION
 OF THE TOTAL RATE THAT EXCEEDS THE 5% LIMIT THROUGH A STANDARD OFFER
 SERVICE TRANSITION CHARGE OVER A 5-YEAR PERIOD BEGINNING 1 YEAR AFTER
 THE INCREASE IN THE TOTAL RATE.

16 (D) (1) ANY STANDARD OFFER SERVICE TRANSITION CHARGE RECOVERED
17 DURING A YEAR MAY NOT BE INCLUDED IN A DETERMINATION OF WHETHER AN
18 ELECTRIC COMPANY'S INCREASE IN THE TOTAL RATE IN ANY YEAR EXCEEDS THE 5%
19 LIMIT.

(2) ANY DISTRIBUTION OR TRANSMISSION RATE INCREASE FOR A YEAR
 APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION, WHETHER APPROVED UNDER A SETTLEMENT
 AGREEMENT OR A RATE PROCEEDING, SHALL BE INCLUDED IN A DETERMINATION
 OF WHETHER AN ELECTRIC COMPANY'S INCREASE IN THE TOTAL RATE IN ANY YEAR
 EXCEEDS THE 5% LIMIT.

(E) (1) BY REGULATION OR ORDER, THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT
PROCEDURES TO IMPLEMENT THIS SECTION, INCLUDING THE CREATION OF A
FORMULA FOR THE RECOVERY FROM RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS OF THE STANDARD
OFFER SERVICE TRANSITION CHARGE OVER A 5-YEAR PERIOD.

29 (2) THE COMMISSION MAY NOT ALLOW THE RECOVERY IN ANY 1 YEAR
30 OF MORE THAN 20% OF THE STANDARD OFFER SERVICE TRANSITION CHARGE
31 IMPOSED FOR A GIVEN SERVICE YEAR.

32 (F) THE STANDARD OFFER SERVICE TRANSITION CHARGE SHALL BE
 33 SEPARATELY STATED ON BILLS TO CUSTOMERS.

34 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 35 June 1, 2006.

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
