1 (1) review the efficacy of, and any legal impediments to, implementing a 2 system of election day voter registration that would allow eligible unregistered voters, 3 commencing with the 2008 primary election, to register and then vote on election day;

4 (2) (i) consult with local election officials in Maryland to ascertain the 5 impact and assess any administrative challenges associated with implementing a 6 statewide system of election day voter registration in this State; and

7 (ii) query election officials in any other states around the country
8 that have implemented statewide election day voter registration about their
9 experiences with such a system;

10 (3) note any legal impediments to implementing a statewide system of 11 election day voter registration and identify any changes to State statutory or

12 constitutional law that would be required to implement such a system;

13(4)estimate the additional cost to the State and to the counties to14implement a system of election day voter registration; and

15 (5) on or before December 31, 2006, submit a report of its findings and 16 recommendations to the Governor, and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State 17 Government Article, to the General Assembly.

18 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor shall 19 allocate the resources required to implement the requirements of this Act, including 20 any gift received by the State for the purposes of this Act under § 2-201 of the State 21 Finance and Procurement Article, and except for federal funds received by the State 22 to implement the requirements of the Help America Vote Act of 2002, any federal or 23 other special funds or grant received by the State in accordance with federal and 24 State law for the purposes of this Act.

25 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26 June 1, 2006.
