- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 (a) (1) (I) A license issued under this title to a driver WHO IS at least 21
- 22 years old AND IS UNDER THE AGE OF 71 shall expire on the birth date of the licensee
- 23 in the fifth year following the issuance of the license.
- 24 (II) A LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS TITLE TO A DRIVER WHO IS AT
- 25 LEAST 71 YEARS OLD SHALL EXPIRE ON THE BIRTH DATE OF THE LICENSEE IN THE
- 26 SECOND YEAR FOLLOWING THE ISSUANCE OF THE LICENSE.
- 27 (2) A license issued under this title to a driver under the age of 21 years
- 28 shall expire 60 days after the driver's 21st birthday.

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1 (3)A license is renewable on the presentation of an application, the 2 payment of the renewal fee required by § 16-111.1 of this subtitle, and satisfactory 3 completion of the examination required or authorized by subsection (h) of this section: 4 Within 6 months before its expiration; or (i) When a driver qualifies for a corrected license issued under § (ii) 6 16-114.1(c) of this subtitle. 7 Except as provided in SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (4) (I) 8 AND subsection (e) of this section, the Administration may not renew an individual's 9 license for more than one consecutive term without requiring the individual to appear 10 in person at an office of the Administration. 11 (II) THE ADMINISTRATION MAY NOT RENEW A LICENSE OF AN 12 INDIVIDUAL WHO IS AT LEAST 66 YEARS OLD WITHOUT REQUIRING THE INDIVIDUAL 13 TO APPEAR IN PERSON AT AN OFFICE OF THE ADMINISTRATION. 14 THE ADMINISTRATION MAY NOT RENEW A LICENSE OF AN (5) (I) 15 INDIVIDUAL IF THE ADMINISTRATION HAS GOOD CAUSE TO BELIEVE THAT THE 16 DRIVING OF A VEHICLE BY THE INDIVIDUAL WOULD BE CONTRARY TO PUBLIC 17 SAFETY AND WELFARE BECAUSE OF AN EXISTING OR SUSPECTED MENTAL OR 18 PHYSICAL DISABILITY. 19 (II)THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL REFER AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS 20 REFUSED A LICENSE RENEWAL UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH TO THE MEDICAL 21 ADVISORY BOARD UNDER § 16-118 OF THIS SUBTITLE. 8 9 10 11 12	(e) If a licensee is absent from this State for cause, other than as provided in subsection (d) of this section, and is unable to renew his license in the manner required by this section, the licensee may renew by mail to the Administration. The renewal application shall be accompanied by the prescribed fee and a statement giving the reason for and the expected length of the absence. On receipt of the application, the Administration may issue a regular license which bears a photo or a notation that it is valid without a photo until 15 days after the licensee first returns to this State.
14 15	(f) An individual may not drive a motor vehicle on any highway in this State if the license issued to him under this title has expired.
16 17	(g) An individual may not attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any highway in this State if the license issued to the individual under this title has expired.
	(h) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, the Administration shall require every individual applying for renewal of a driver's license to pass a vision test as prescribed by the Administration.
	(2) (i) The Administration shall accept a certification of acceptable visual acuity from a licensed physician or optometrist instead of requiring the actual test provided for in this subsection.
24 25	(ii) The examination for which certification is made shall take place within 12 months of the date of application for renewal.
28	(3) An individual at least 21 years of age but under the age of 40 years may apply for renewal of a driver's license electronically or by mail or other means authorized by the Administration without taking a vision test if the applicant has passed a vision test authorized by the Administration within the previous 6 years.
32	(4) (i) If the Administration has reason to believe that an individual is a safety hazard by reason of a vision deficiency, the Administration may require the vision test provided for in this subsection at a time other than renewal of a driver's license.
34 35	(ii) The Administration may adopt regulations to implement the provisions of this subsection.
38	(i) Before the expiration of a driver's license, if the Administration has reason to believe that an individual is not a safety hazard, but the individual is unable to pass a required knowledge test or vision test, the Administration may extend the individual's privilege to drive for a period not to exceed 90 days.
