10 Preamble

- 11 WHEREAS, February is the National Black History Month; and
- WHEREAS, Many important events occurred during the month of January of
- 13 special importance to all Americans that play an important role in Black History,
- 14 including the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, the
- 15 passage the 13th Amendment of the U.S. Constitution by Congress on January 31,
- 16 1865, which abolished slavery, and the ratification of the 24th Amendment of the U.S.
- 17 Constitution on January 23, 1964, which made it illegal to condition the right to vote
- 18 in federal elections on the payment of a poll tax or other tax and made it easier for
- 19 Black Americans to register to vote; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Many famous Black Americans were born during the month of
- 21 January, including Martin Luther King, Jr., George Washington Carver, Sojourner
- 22 Truth, and Nathaniel Turner; and
- 23 WHEREAS, All Americans should learn about and recognize the achievements
- 24 of Black Americans, the important role that Black Americans played throughout the
- 25 entire history of the United States, and the scientific, literary, and social impact of
- 26 Black Americans on our world today; and

## **UNOFFICIAL COPY OF HOUSE BILL 1428**

- WHEREAS, The General Assembly believes that the months of January and
- 2 February should be commemorated as the Black History Months in Maryland; now,
- 3 therefore,
- 4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 6 Article State Government
- 7 13-502.
- 8 (A) IN RECOGNITION OF THE HISTORICAL CONTRIBUTIONS THAT BLACK
- 9 AMERICANS HAVE MADE TO THE STATE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROCLAIM THE
- 10 MONTHS OF JANUARY AND FEBRUARY EACH YEAR AS BLACK HISTORY MONTHS.
- 11 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL
- 12 ORGANIZATIONS TO OBSERVE BLACK HISTORY MONTHS PROPERLY WITH
- 13 APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES.
- 14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 15 October 1, 2006.
