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Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System - Membership - Harford County Sheriff's Office

4 FOR the purpose of providing that an individual serving as the Harford County

- 5 Sheriff may elect to participate in the Employees' Pension System; providing
- 6 that an individual serving as the Harford County Sheriff who does not elect
- 7 membership in the Employees' Pension System within a certain period of time is
- 8 required to join the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; providing that
- 9 certain deputy sheriffs employed by the Harford County Sheriff's Office are
- 10 eligible to participate in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System;
- 11 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to members of
- 12 the Harford County Sheriff's Office participating in the Law Enforcement
- 13 Officers' Pension System.
