14 15	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

	(a) (1) Except as provided in § 18-307 of this subtitle, the Office shall determine the amount of each Educational Excellence Award based on the financial need of the applicant.
21 22	(2) In determining the amount of financial need, the Office shall consider regional cost-of-living differences.
25	(3) IN DETERMINING THE PERCENT OF FINANCIAL NEED USED TO CALCULATE AN AWARD FOR A COMMUNITY COLLEGE STUDENT RECEIVING AN EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD, THE COMMISSION SHALL USE THE FOLLOWING PERCENTAGES:

- (I) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2007, NOT LESS THAN 50%;

12 public institution of higher education within the University System of Maryland,
