ANY MONEY RECEIVED BY THE COUNCIL UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF 2 THIS SECTION SHALL BE USED TO HELP ADMINISTER THE FUND AND PERFORM 3 OTHER FUNCTIONS THAT BENEFIT RURAL AREAS AS THE COUNCIL DETERMINES.
