3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Youth Advisory Council; providing for

- 4 the appointment, membership, terms, and duties of the Council; providing for
- 5 the appointment of the cochairs of the Council; providing for the staffing for the
- 6 Council; requiring the Council to work with the Department of Education
- 7 regarding the granting of school credit for Council service; requiring the Council
- 8 to hold certain meetings and conduct certain public hearings; providing that a
- 9 member of the Council may not receive compensation as a member of the
- 10 Council, but is entitled to certain reimbursement; requiring the Council to make
- 11 an annual report to the Governor and the General Assembly; specifying the
- 12 terms of the initial members of the Council; defining certain terms; and
- 13 generally relating to the Maryland Youth Advisory Council.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initialmembers of the Maryland Youth Advisory Council shall expire as follows:

22 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 23 October 1, 2006.
