### 1 AN ACT concerning

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### Public Safety - Volunteer Company Assistance Fund - Grants and Loans

3 FOR the purpose of clarifying that certain permissible reasons for awards from the

4 Volunteer Company Assistance Fund apply only to grants from the Fund;

5 altering a prohibition on certain grant or loan awards from being used to

6 refinance certain debts or obligations; clarifying that certain requirements

7 regarding documents to be included with requests for awards from the Fund

8 only apply to loan requests repealing a prohibition against the Board of Public

9 Works making certain loans from the Fund if a certain volunteer company has

10 <u>not made a good faith effort to obtain money from its local government;</u>

11 clarifying that a requirement that a certain volunteer company certify that the

12 company made a certain application and was denied only applies to grant

13 requests; altering the circumstances under which a volunteer company may

14 appeal certain actions of the Maryland State Firemen's Association; providing

15 that the Treasurer shall disburse certain money from Fund to the Association;

16 altering a requirement that a certain volunteer company submit certain

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- 1 financial statements to the Association; providing that the intent of the General
- 2 Assembly is that the Governor include an appropriation for the Fund in the
- 3 annual State budget; and generally relating to grants and loans from the
- 4 Volunteer Company Assistance Fund.

### 10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Public Safety

13 8-203.

14 (a) The purpose of the Fund is to ensure adequate fire protection and rescue 15 services in the State.

16 (b) A grant or loan awarded under this section shall be used only for17 purchasing, replacing, or improving:

18 (1) equipment, including elevated equipment, pumpers, tankers, ladder
 19 trucks, ambulances, rescue vehicles, or other large equipment used for fire fighting
 20 and emergency services;

21 (2) communications equipment;

(3) protective equipment, including helmets, turnout coats and pants,
boots, eyeshields, gloves, and self-contained respiratory protection units;

24 (4) any other equipment necessary to carry out the ordinary functions of 25 supporting fire fighting and rescue activities; or

26 (5) facilities used to house fire fighting equipment, ambulances, and 27 rescue vehicles.

28 (c) (1) (i) A volunteer company receiving a grant from the Fund shall 29 provide at least a 30% match of the amount of the grant.

30 (ii) If a volunteer company cannot reasonably provide the required 31 match before the grant is disbursed, the Board of Public Works may waive the

32 requirement or may allow repayment of the match within a reasonable time not

33 exceeding 18 months after the purchase, replacement, or improvement of the

34 equipment or facilities.

(2)Money to provide the required match may include contributions 1 (i) 2 from local government. 3 (ii) A local government may not reduce the amount of money that 4 the volunteer company would otherwise be entitled to receive from the local 5 government because of State money provided under this section. Loans from the Fund may only be awarded to assist with up to 75% of 6 (3) 7 the total cost of the equipment or facilities being purchased. 8 After a favorable recommendation from the Association, the Board of (d) 9 Public Works may award a grant, loan, or both from the Fund to a volunteer company 10 if: 11 (1)FOR A GRANT AWARD: 12 an act of God or other unforeseen event substantially impairs (i) 13 the ability of the volunteer company to provide adequate and safe service; or 14 the volunteer company is unable to maintain the minimum (ii) 15 level of performance for adequate and safe service established by standards of the 16 Association because of a demonstrated lack of financial resources: and 17 the Association and the volunteer company have executed an (2)18 agreement that: 19 (i) provides that the grant or loan will be used as represented to 20 the Board of Public Works in the request for approval; and 21 (ii) gives to the State security in the equipment or facilities 22 purchased with the [grant or] loan and in the proceeds of that equipment or those 23 facilities as determined by the Board of Public Works to be appropriate and adequate. 24 A grant or loan awarded under this section may not: (e) 25 be used to refinance a debt or other obligation of a volunteer company (1)26 [incurred before July 1, 1982]; or be spent to replace or repair eligible items to the extent that 27 (2)28 insurance proceeds are available for those purposes. 29 The Board of Public Works may not approve a grant or loan from (f)

(f) The Board of Public Works may not approve a grant <u>or loan</u> or loan from
 30 the Fund to a volunteer company if the volunteer company has not made a good faith
 31 effort to obtain money from its local government.

(a) (1) A volunteer company shall submit each request for a grant or loan
from the Fund to the Association for approval by a board of review in accordance with
the Association's bylaws.

16 (c) On approval of a request for a grant or loan, the Association or the panel 17 shall transmit its recommendation to the Board of Public Works.

1 (ii) documentation of the volunteer company's actual expenditures 2 from the grant or loan;

4 loan term, payment terms, payment amount, payments made to date, outstanding
5 balance, and loan status; and

6 (5) summary listings of grants and loans made during the previous fiscal 7 year and outstanding loans, by county.

8 (b) The Department shall:

9 (1) review the documentation submitted in accordance with subsection 10 (a) of this section on an annual basis to determine if each grant or loan was spent in 11 accordance with this subtitle and the request approved by the Board of Public Works; 12 and

13 (2) report the findings to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee 14 and the House Appropriations Committee on an annual basis.

15 (c) The Legislative Auditor may:

16 (1) review the documentation submitted in accordance with subsection 17 (a) of this section to determine if each grant or loan was spent in accordance with this 18 subtitle and the requests approved by the Board of Public Works; and

19(2)report the findings to the Department and, subject to § 2-1246 of the20State Government Article, to the Joint Audit Committee of the General Assembly.

21 (d) The Comptroller may audit the financial affairs of the Association to 22 ensure compliance with this subtitle.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the

24 General Assembly that the Governor shall include in the annual State budget an

25 appropriation for the Volunteer Company Assistance Fund.

26 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 2006.
