- 9 (1) The Governor shall include in the annual budget for fiscal year 2009,
- 10 and for every subsequent fiscal year in which a statewide general election is
- 1 scheduled, an appropriation for the State Board of Elections in an amount not less
- 12 than \$1,095,720 to subsidize the salaries of election judges in accordance with §
- 13 10-205(a)(2) of the State Government Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
- 14 (2) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the amount specified in
- 15 paragraph (1) of this section be adjusted for each applicable fiscal year as needed to
- 16 meet the projected amount of subsidy for elections in that fiscal year.
- 17 (3) If money is not appropriated in the fiscal year 2007 budget to fully
- 18 subsidize the salaries of election judges in accordance with § 10-205(a)(2) of the State
- 19 Government Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, this Act may not be construed
- 20 to apply to the elections that occur in 2006.
